(Proposed by Act No. 2011-543)

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, effective January 1, 2014, to amend Section 247 relating to the authority of the Legislature concerning banks and banking, to repeal various other provisions of Article XIII concerning banks and banking; and to repeal Amendment 154 to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 255.01 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, subject to the contingency that a new Article XII of the state constitution is adopted that repeals existing Section 232 of the state constitution, and subject to the contingency that Sections 10A-2-15.01 and 10A-2-15.02, Code of Alabama 1975, are repealed. Relating to Cullman County, proposing an amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, to grant sixteenth section and school lands located in Cullman County, and held in trust by the state for education purposes in Cullman County, to the Cullman County Board of Education; to authorize the Cullman County Board of Education to manage, sell, lease, and control those lands; and to provide for the distribution of any proceeds and interest from the sale, lease, or other disposition of the land or the sale of timber, minerals, or other natural resources generated by the land.
